Organic poultry producers in Wales have consistently identified difficulties in sourcing pullets as one of their biggest problems. A number of producers are interested in rearing pullets, both for their own use and to supply other producers, but are prevented from doing so by a lack of information in key areas.

Over the last six months Organic Centre Wales has been tackling the key issues using resources from the new 'Better Organic Business Links' project and the Farming Connect Organic Development Programme. A summary of the project is attached for your information.
